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Staci K. Oertle, MSN, APN, ANP-BC, AOCNP; Todd Rapczynski, MS, NREMT-P, CCEMT-P; Evelyn Robles-Rodríguez, DNP, APN, AOCN; and Zoe Tirado, MHS, PA-C, joined Culture Missions of Washington Township on a transformative week-long missionary journey to the Dominican Republic, from June 21 to June 28. They traveled to six remote, poverty-stricken villages in the heart of the island, bringing much-needed aid to communities with limited access to basic health care and supplies. The medical team provided screening and support to 45 to 50 adult patients per village along with their children, the majority of whom had nutritional deficits related to poverty and deprived living conditions.

Missionary efforts were comprehensive, focusing on everything from medical and eye care to parasite treatment, hair care, and the distribution of sports equipment. Culture Missions extends its gratitude to the Cooper employees and

friends who helped by donating a wide range of essential items, including reading glasses, hygiene products, over the counter medications and vitamins, dental supplies, and medical equipment as well as monetary support. Every single donated item was distributed by the mission team to the villagers, leaving a lasting and immense impact on the farms and communities they visited.

Additionally, **Staci Oertle and Evelyn Robles-Rodriguez** provided education on the management of the side effects of cancer immunotherapies to over sixty medical residents, nurses, and physicians at the Dr. Jaime Oliver Pino Hospital in San Pedro de Macoris. Staci and Evelyn, along with Zoe Tirado and Miriam Otero also served in a panel discussion for cancer survivors at the Instituto Nacional del Cancer Rosa Emilia Sanchez Perez de Tavares (INCART) cancer center in Santo Domingo where over fifty survivors and their caregivers attended along with providers. Both hospitals received donations including medical gloves, educational materials, wigs and postmastectomy care supplies.

Learn about our Graduate APN Program

Our Graduate Advanced Practice Nurse (GAPN) program supports nurses who have completed an accredited graduate nursing program and are scheduled to take their Board Specialty Certification Examination. While awaiting certification, GAPNs may work in a temporary position created to fill an existing vacancy in a specialty APN role under the supervision of a licensed Advanced Practice Nurse (APN) Preceptor. Their scope of practice mirrors that of a specialty clinical practice registered nurse, and they receive a designated GAPN pay rate. Ideally, within 90 days of hire, the GAPN successfully passes the ANCC or AANP national specialty board examination and obtains their New Jersey APN license, officially transitioning into the full APN role, and then completes the credentialing process through Cooper's medical staff office. The new advanced practice nurse transfers into the open APN position in which they have been orienting as a GAPN within the ambulatory or inpatient setting at Cooper.

■ Update on AP Council and APP Committees

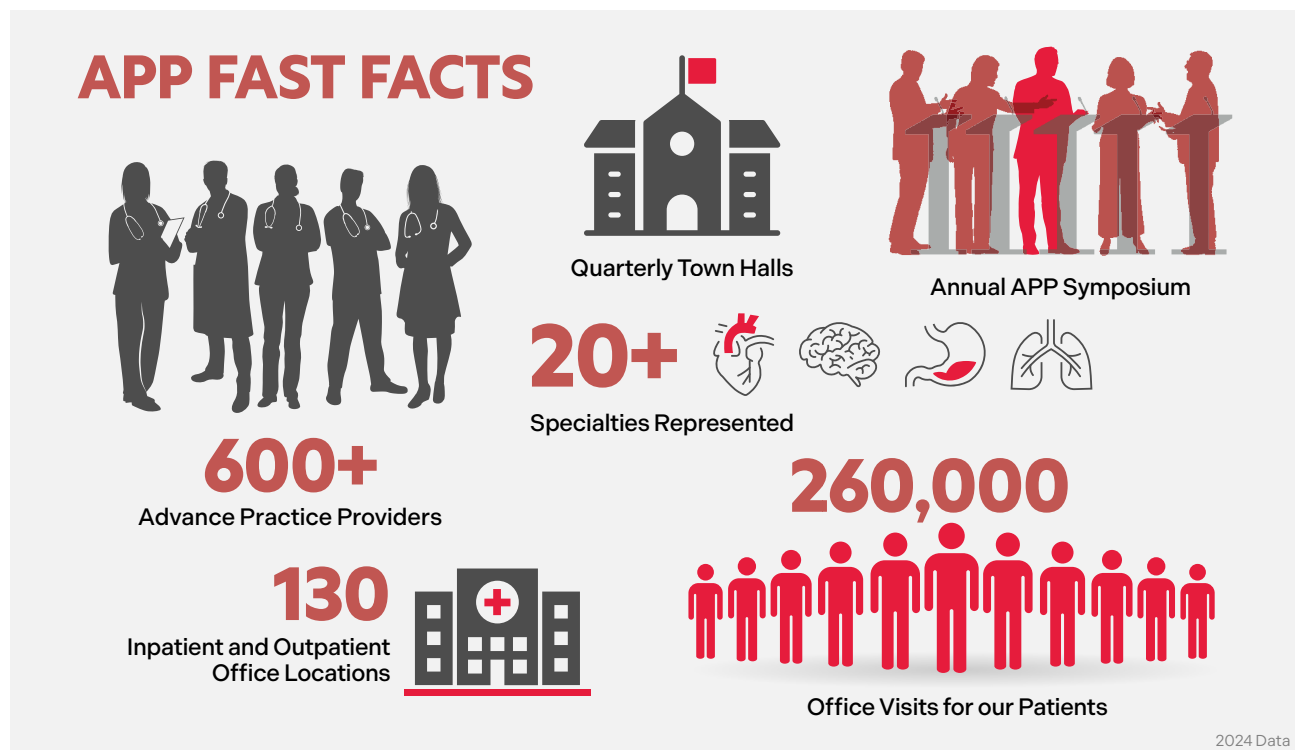
ADVANCED PRACTICE COUNCIL

Cooper's AP Council has three main committees, each with subcommittees:

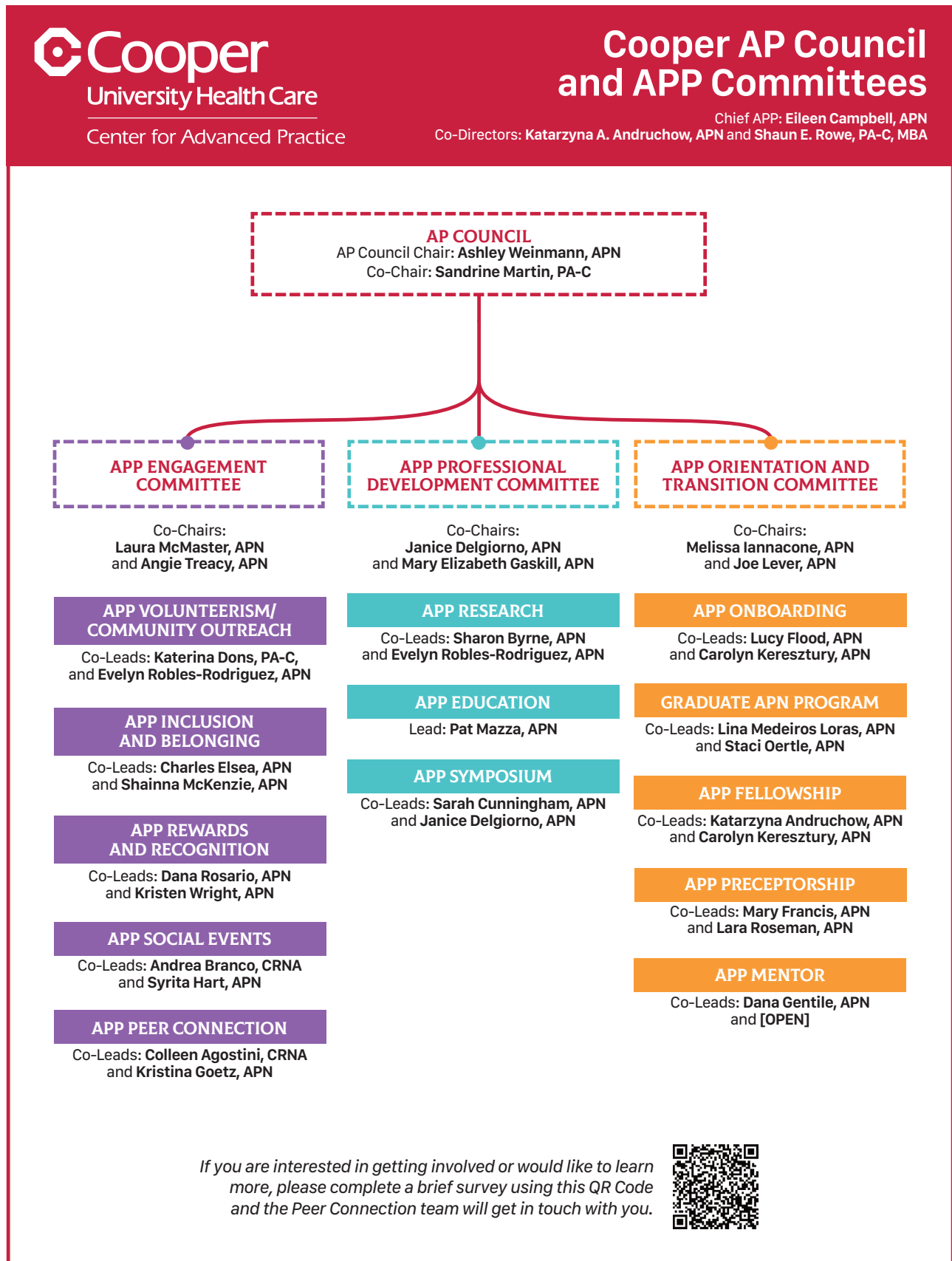
